RESTOULE LOCAL SERVICES BOARD

This past year had the Board quite busy with improvements planned and completed at the Village Public Boat Launch. The Boat Launch now has improved lighting as well as a new dock system. There will also be enhancements made to the ramp as well with the addition of several concrete runners.

The Porters Landing Boat Launch also saw some improvements to the docks and parking area. We are currently investigating improvements to the Boat Launch at Commanda Lake. The improvements will include the addition of a dock structure, lighting and boat ramp enhancements.

Ownership of the Restoule Fire Department's rescue boat was transferred from the Restoule Local Services Board to the Restoule Fire Department.

T he Legion also saw improvements with the installation of a new well and the decommissioning of the old well (at no charge) by Ransom Drilling.

T his past Fall and Spring saw the addition of a new wheelchair accessible washroom at the Legion Building. The Legion was also successful with a Trillium Grant request which will see an expansion/renovation to the Legion Kitchen and Seating area. These improvements will allow the Legion to provide enhanced programming clientele to our community and district.

The Community Centre also saw an upgrade to their water purification system. A big thank you to the Restoule Fire Ladies Auxiliary for their contribution of \$500.00! In addition, the Community Centre will soon see enhanced heating and cooling with the installation of state of the art heat pumps, which will result in cost effective heating and long awaited cooling to the Kitchen and Hall.

Community Centre Parking. Trucks with trailers are no longer allowed to park in the Restoule Community Centre parking lot – due to shortage of parking spaces during scheduled events. Parking is allowed at the designated lot across from the ball park, identified as 67 Hawthorne Drive. Please respect posted signage.

RESTOULE VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT FIRE and/or MEDICAL EMERGENCY DIAL 911

We have had a good year for fire calls, thanks to you – the public! You have helped us by being careful with your fires. Please check chimneys on a regular basis, and have heating checked and serviced by a professional. Give us a call ahead of time if you're planning any brush burning. This will help us let you know if conditions are good.

Smoke alarms are required on every level of your home and outside sleeping areas. *IT'S THE LAW!* A handy tip – change the batteries in your smoke alarms once a year on a date that you will remember, like a birthday or daylight savings time. We still conduct surprise visits to check and replace old smoke alarms. It is also a good idea to plan an escape route with your family in case of a fire. *Carbon monoxide (CO) detectors are now the Law!*

CHIEF'S REPORT. We are answering more medical calls due to an aging population. If you're insurance requires you to have a "Wet Dry" chimney inspection, contact Claude St.Pierre, technician/system advisor with Fern's Heating Inc. at 705-474-4955.

LANDFILL PERMITS

Permits can be purchased at the gate, \$60 Residential and \$240 Commercial. Permits need to be purchased on or before Aug 1, 2017 – you can and will be denied entry to the Landfill if you do not have a permit. THERE WILL BE A SURCHARGE OF \$15.00 FOR PERMITS PURCHASED AFTER AUG 1, 2017.

IMPORTANT

- No fire ashes allowed in the Landfill. They start fires even in the winter. Keep fees down, it costs money to put fires out.
- Please open bags of recycling and dump in bin loose.
- Remember to crush cans and flatten cardboard to conserve space in bins.
- Tin cans may also be added to Metals Bin.

BEARS

Almost all recorded bear attacks in the wild have resulted when a bear feels threatened, is hungry, or has her cubs present. Please keep your distance from any bears that you may encounter at the Landfill and especially keep children and dogs from bears.

HAZARDOUS WASTE

Restoule Landfill does not accept any hazardous waste, including paint, oil, light bulbs with mercury and refrigerators. We ask that you dispose of such waste responsibly at the North Bay Waste Depot, off Seymour St at 112 Patton St. – closed Sun, Mon & Tue, open Wed to Sat, 8am to 6pm.

RESTOULE UNITED CHURCH & UCW

Restoule United Church has had a good year. Although the church has not experienced any growth in recent years, a dedicated core congregation still manages to hold weekly services and carry out the necessary business of the church as well as some outreach and support within and outside the community.

The highlight of the year was our celebration of Restoule United Church's 120th anniversary. Beginning as a Methodist church, it became part of the United Church of Canada after amalgamation in 1925 and in 1949, the original church (built in 1896) was rebuilt in the same location. On August 14th, the church enjoyed a full house with attendance of 87 at the Anniversary Service which was led by Rev. Kathleen McCallum. A bountiful luncheon catered by the Restoule Firemen's Auxiliary was enjoyed by 101 persons. A table had been set up in the Community Centre with a historical display of old church records, literary historical material, and photographs. A slide show played throughout and the luncheon and fellowship time rendering memories of church and UCW functions and events.

Although congregation numbers have diminished in recent years, Restoule United Church still managed to donate to the Fort McMurray Relief Fund in May 2017 and has donated locally to the Powassan Food Bank. Cards are sent to local residents at times of illness and bereavement. Recently, the Church Council arranged for placement on church grounds of a Canadian Diabetes Association drop box for used clothing and it has already seen considerable use by community residents.

We are grateful for our very caring and capable Pulpit Supply ministry which consists of retired ordained ministers and trained lay worship leaders who lead the congregation in thoughtful, meaningful weekly church services.

PATTERSON TOWNSHIP LOCAL ROADS BOARD

On May 3, 2017, the LRB, along with the Ministry of Transportation, will be conducting the annual spring road tour to establish the budget and work to be done for the period of April 1, 2017 to March 31, 2018. The work program usually involves: replacing a number of culverts, ditching, brushing, graveling, grading and calcium throughout the township. This summer, Olive, Janice and part of Beaudry Hill road will be hard surfaced. Parts of Limberlost and Porters Landing Road are scheduled for hard surfacing next year. If you have any concerns or ideas for improving our roads, please call one of the numbers below.

This year, winter was a little crazier than others. We spent double the amount budgeted on snowplowing, and sanding was up by \$2 000. A common complaint in regards to sanding is the "salt and pepper" application. We will investigate the possibilities of heavier applications with the contractor. The cost of dust laying (calcium) was double. We had to call for a second application of calcium since the first application produced very poor results. This was due to the road surface being too dry, a problem that will be rectified this summer.

Any entrances that are being constructed "must" have the approval of the Board and installed to MTO specifications. Applications are available from Jean Mohr.

Please, do not park in the snowplowing and grading "turn-arounds" located at the end of many of our roads. In addition, parking is not permitted on our roads during winter maintenance. Homeowners may be responsible for the cost of removing snow that has been pushed onto a roadway.

 ${f P}$ lowing of snow will not commence until there is 3" of snow. In the past it was 4".

The MTO Field supervisor will monitor roads for icy conditions and call the sand trucks accordingly. However, the Board may request plowing and sanding if deemed necessary. Bus routes will be given priority.
