RESTOULE LOCAL SERVICES BOARD COMMUNITY UPDATE

The Board would like to share some accomplishments that were achieved over the past year as well as upcoming improvements planned for this coming summer.

The Community Centre had three Heat Pumps and one Air Conditioning Unit installed last Summer. The Heat Pumps provide two key functions, cooling in the summer and heating in the winter. This technology is one of the most energy efficient and cost effective solutions for heating and cooling. With this improvement the Community Centre offers a comfortable setting for community events all year long.

We are also happy to report that the Board was successful in securing a grant from the Ontario Trillium Foundation. These funds will be used to install a Barrier Free entrance and washroom facility at the Community Centre this summer. A special thank you to the Restoule & District Lions Club for their \$5000 contribution to this project.

The Fire Department will also see some improvements to their space with the replacement of the office door and window along with the replacement of the flooring in the office and training room.

The expansion of the Legion began construction this past Fall and is scheduled for completion this Spring. This addition will provide for enhanced programming for clientele in our Community and District. This project is a true example of what can be accomplished when a community pulls together!

The community boat launches saw many improvements last summer. However, due to high water levels not all work was able to be completed. The Village Boat Ramp still requires the addition of several concrete runners. The Porter Landing Boat Launch will see the pouring of a concrete pad that will be used to secure one of the dock units.

The Board will also be proceeding with improvements to the Commanda Lake Boat Launch, with the addition of a crib and dock system along with a light system.

This past Winter the Board also purchased a new snow blower in order to clear the snow from the outdoor skating/ hockey arena.

Last Summer, the Board was approached to have a Pickleball Court painted onto the outdoor Hockey Arena pad. The request was granted and the court has been painted. Pickleball is a new sport that has evolved by combining the concept of Tennis and Ping Pong. It is played on a smaller court using a baseball size plastic ball and ping pong like paddles. It is a great form of exercise but less strenuous than tennis.

Important Community Centre Parking Update – Due to the shortage of parking spaces during scheduled events, trucks with trailers are to park in the designated lot across from the ball park, identified at 67 Hawthorne Drive. Please respect posted signage.

911 CIVIC ADDRESS SIGNS

All properties must have a 911 civic address sign to direct emergency services to the property. Please contact Jean Mohr, LSB Secretary if there have been any alterations to your driveway entrance, additional entrances or you require a sign, etc.

SEPTIC TANK REBATES

The \$40 rebate for having a septic tank emptied remains in effect for business, home and cottage owners. This rebate is allowed once every five years through the LSB. For information, please contact Jean Mohr, LSB Secretary.

PATTERSON TOWNSHIP LOCAL ROADS BOARD

The Ministry of Transportation and LRB trustees held its annual budget meeting and spring road tour on April 25. The purpose was to establish the work to be done for the period of April 1, 2018 to March 31, 2019. The work program usually involves: replacing a number of culverts, ditching, brushing, graveling, grading and calcium throughout the township. This summer, we are hoping to extend the hard surfacing to Porter's Landing Road and possibly a portion of Limberlost Point Road.

This year, we had a continuous mix of snow followed by freezing rain forcing the Board to call out the snowplow and sander more than any other year. There is little doubt that we will be over budget in this area. We also did a double layer of calcium producing better results than last year. In addition to the regular maintenance we had two of our roads with major washouts. Fortunately, traffic disruption was held to a minimum.

Please note the following:

Any entrances that are being constructed “must” have the approval of the Board and installed to MTO specifications. Applications are available from Jean Mohr.

Please, do not park in the snowplowing and grading “turn-arounds” located at the end of many of our roads. In addition, parking is not permitted on our roads during winter maintenance. Homeowners may be responsible for the cost of removing snow that has been pushed onto a roadway.

Plowing of snow will not commence until there is 3” of snow. In the past it was 4”.

The MTO Field supervisor will monitor roads for icy conditions and call the sand trucks accordingly. However, the Board may request plowing and sanding if deemed necessary. Bus routes will be given priority. If you have any ideas for improving our roads, please call one of the numbers below. If you have concerns, you should contact the chair.

IMPORTANT

- No fire ashes allowed in the Landfill. They start fires even in the winter. Keep fees down, it costs money to put fires out.
- Please open bags of recycling and dump in bin loose. Put loose bags in barrel.
- Remember to crush cans and flatten cardboard to conserve space in bins.
- Tin cans may also be added to Metals Bin.
- ***Please note*** – New Bin is just for Provincial Park – Do Not Use
- Landfill does not accept hazardous waste items. e.g. paint, oil, light bulbs with mercury and refrigerators

BEARS

Almost all recorded bear attacks in the wild have resulted when a bear feels threatened, is hungry, or has her cubs present. Please keep your distance from any bears that you may encounter at the Landfill and especially keep children and dogs from bears.

Hello Everyone!

I would like to remind all of you to check your chimneys before starting up your fires in the fall and also check on a regular basis throughout the heating season. If you have a heating source other than wood have it serviced by a professional to make sure you and your family are safe.

If you are going to do any brush or other cleanup burning, please give us a call so we can advise you if conditions are acceptable. We go by the Ministry of Natural Resources rules for this kind of burning.

If you are calling from a cell phone for **911** sometime you will not get through. So this number will get you in ...it is **705-474-7400** . Be aware of your property's 911 address number located at the front of your property

As some of you may know our fire fighters are aging. It would be very nice to have some younger people join and that certainly includes females. If you are summer people and would like to give your expertise, come and see us.

The installation of working Smoke Alarms and Carbon Monoxide (CO) detectors **are the law in every house**. Smoke alarms must be placed on every level and outside the sleeping areas. Just a handy tip -check the batteries yearly. Pick your birthday, time change or sometime like that. You should also go over an escape plan with the family and once outside have a safe place for everyone to meet.

If your insurance requires you to have a wet dry chimney inspection contact Claude St. Pierre. He is with Ferns Heating Inc. 705-474-4955.

Please respect their wishes by staying on the trails. This is a privilege they have bestowed upon us for the enjoyment of snowmobiling, which would not be possible without them.

This summer and fall we will be trying to get the trail from the south back into Powassan utilizing Municipal road allowances. We will be applying for Federal funding assistance due to the length of the trail, the topical terrain and required bridge work which would not be possible without funding help.

Hope you all have a great off season and see you all again on the trails next winter!!

- To exercise the Interment Right, the Purchaser or his personal representative, must provide the Certificate of Interment Rights and the Contract.
- The Purchaser of an Interment Rights may transfer title of the Interment Rights by returning the Certificate of Interment Rights to the Board of Trustees with a letter requesting the transfer and naming the person the plot is to be transferred to.
